Course Attendees

This course is suitable for anyone who cares for children and infants such as parents, grandparents or babysitters.

Delegates must be a minimum of 14 years of age and a certificate can be offered to all, subject to assessment. A delegate cannot assume a responsibility in the workplace for children and infants until they reach the age of 16, and then it is the employer's responsibility to ensure that the delegate is suitable for the role. The certificate will expire as dated on the certificate, irrespective of age.

Note

Due to the practical nature of this course, it is requested that delegate's wear suitable clothing i.e. trousers and clean footwear.
