



Asbestos Non-Licensed Operative Refresher (UKATA)

Introduction

The Asbestos Non-Licensed Operative Refresher course refreshes and updates the knowledge gained on the Asbestos Non-Licensed Operative course. It is for those who will knowingly be working with Asbestos-Containing Materials (ACMs) where that work is not classified as "licensable work with asbestos" (The Control of Asbestos Regulations 2012). This is typically referred to as non-licensable or notifiable non-licensable (NNLW) work as detailed in the HSE guidance Asbestos Essentials – HSG210.



Course Duration

SSG offer this course over half a day as a classroom course.



Course Attendees

The Control of Asbestos Regulations 2012 states that "refresher training should be given at least every year." Therefore, anyone who has carried out the Asbestos Non-Licensed Operative course will require this annual refresher. This includes a refresher of the Asbestos Awareness syllabus; delegates do not need to attend the Asbestos Awareness refresher course in addition to this course.

Note

Delegates **must** have previously attended the full UKATA Asbestos Non-Licensed Operative course and supply certificates or evidence of this training prior to course commencement. A skills analysis will be undertaken at the start of the course to confirm delegates attending have retained information from their previous course and ensure refresher training is sufficient.



Course Programme

Project and practical work will refresh a delegate's knowledge of:

- History, types and properties of asbestos
- Possible effects on health
- Locations / identification of possible ACMs
- Relevant legislation to include the Control of Asbestos Regulations 2006
- Types of asbestos surveys
- The role of licensed asbestos removal contractors
- Risk assessments and method statements

- Control limits
- PPE and RPE
- Safe methods of working with unlicensed ACMs to include Asbestos Essentials HSG210
- Decontamination process
- Waste handling procedures
- Emergency procedures



Training Certification and Assessment

Delegates are required to carry out a written assessment as well as being assessed on their input during the practical exercise and their feedback. UKATA certification will be provided on successful completion of the training and it is valid for one year. UKATA require annual refresher training for delegates having attended this course.

ID cards can be requested at an additional cost of £7.50 per delegate.
