





NEBOSH International General Certificate e-learning

Introduction

The International General Certificate is recognised around the world, with over 170,000 people worldwide who have passed this qualification. Many undertake this certificate as a first step in a career in health and safety as it gives a valuable overview and is a sound basis for further professional study.

The qualification looks at general workplace issues and can be applied across many sectors. It looks at everyday solutions and provides delegates with the knowledge, understanding and skills to help protect the health and safety of all workers.



Course Duration

SSG offer this as an e-learning course, which takes approximately 120 hours to complete, plus a scenario-based assessment and a practical risk assessment. Delegates will be able to check their progress throughout the course using the e-learning checks at the end of each part of the course.

Delegates will be given a 12 month licence upon first access, in which to complete the course. Once this licence expires, delegates will be required to pay a fee to reactivate it and must contact our Customer Service Team for more information.



Course Attendees

This course is suitable for anyone in any type of organisation; managers, supervisors and workers. It is suited to those who need a broad understanding of health and safety issues in order to manage day-to-day risks effectively.

Note

The standard of English required by learners studying for the IGC must be a minimum of level 3 proficiency, ensuring they can both understand and articulate the concepts contained within the syllabus.
